September

I arrived in London mid September. To my understanding, you do not need to arrive in London so early, considering the first day of orientation being on the last few days of September. You should have enough time to settle down, but I decided to arrive 2 weeks prior to the orientation as I visited friends in Guildford and I do not live in a school-hosted student accommodation. You never know what could go wrong so better safe than sorry.

Most of September was just me trying to figure out how to go places and getting comfortable with the surroundings. I went to a few tourist attractions in London such as the Tower Bridge, London Eye, Buckingham Palace and many more. I strongly recommend exploring more of London early on in your exchange, because the sun sets at 4pm starting late October.

October

October is when the real studying part starts. I took 4 courses in total, 2 of which being Historic London and Performing Arts in London. Note that you really have to sit in front of your computer when course enrollment starts in order to secure your quota for the culture modules. The class sizes aren't the largest and people are so eager to get into this course. The courses themselves were a lot of fun and enriching.

In Historic London, we would visit different important tourist attractions/historical establishments in London to better understand the formation of the civilization of London and the role that London played in the middle ages. This course does involve a lot more European history and can be very fun for a history enjoyer. But I will say that if you are not a good listener or memorizer, this is not the course for you as the entire examination is based on information talked about during the city walks. It is literally impossible to drop notes during these city walks and the in-class powerpoint slides aren't exactly the most useful resources.

Performing Arts in London is another culture module that I enrolled in. This course covers every aspect of modern and the historical development of multiple forms of arts such as ballet, theater, operas and etc.. We go really in-depth by reading literature, scripts, video clips and live performances to learn how to appreciate these art forms. In general, I find it pretty interesting and I definitely recommend it if you are somewhat interested in middle age art and how European history influences the transpose and development of different art forms.

November

The first half of November was really enjoyable and pleasant. I visited a few other cities such as Birmingham, Brighton etc.. I personally enjoy short trips and occasional escapes, but only when the weather is pleasant. We all know by now that London rains a lot. However, the tricky part is that the rain isn't heavy enough for me to use an umbrella, but more than enough to soak my coat. This is a very consistent observation and sometimes you cannot even use an umbrella because the wind will definitely flip your umbrella inside out. Other than that, I think it's really worthwhile to visit different cities apart from London because different parts of the UK give off really different vibes.

I also took a trip to Gothenburg with a friend during November. We went to a museum, a theme park and many local food courts. The most enjoyable part of the trip for me was the food, but the most not-so-enjoyable part was again the weather. I guess I'm just not built to live in a 0 to -8 degree climate with very strong wind and rain. I was already so exhausted on day 3 of the trip because of the unpleasant weather.

Another significant part of November are the deadlines. My overall workload was definitely not heavy compared to what we usually have in UST, but a lot of my assignments were either essays or group reports, which do require quite a bit of reading and writing. In general, the workload was definitely handleable.

December

Final exams took place mid to late December. I was lucky as most of my courses did not have final exams. We did group projects and research essays instead. Exchange students take their exams in December, whereas home students do it mid to late Jan after the Christmas holiday.

I am a free soul after exams. I did quite a lot of shopping over Christmas and met up with a bunch of friends who were studying in London. Christmas celebrations in London are really next level. The Lucifer decorations in Regent Street are iconic as always and the Christmas vibe is really on point. Only drawback is that the city center is flooded with humans and public transportation does not operate on Christmas day to my surprise.

January

Nothing much really happened in Jan as the holidays are over and the home students have to take their exams so nobody is free to hangout, so I did some vintage hunting in Camden market and Brick Lane and picked up a few statement pieces to add to my wardrobe. It was also a struggle to pack my luggage because I may or may not have brought too many things and I cannot fit everything in my luggage.
